For years I was a high school varsity basketball coach. The school I coached at had a storied football tradition complete with district, regional and state championships, players who went on to have great college careers and even a couple who made it all the way to the NFL; the basketball program, not so much. The gym in which the basketball team played was tapered with banners that commemorated the season accomplishments of several of the school's sports programs, with one noticeable exception, the basketball team! No one could recall the last winning season that the basketball program had. Each new generation that played football at this school came onto the team with pride and the knowledge of the great winning legacy that was forged before them, and that the expectation for them was to carry that legacy on. Basketball on the other hand had a legacy of losing, disappointment and low expectations.

The second year of my tenure, things changed. We had a team of talented, disciplined and smart players. We started the season off with them doing something that neither they

nor anyone else had ever seen, they were winning! Then one night in the middle of the season the best team in our district, who was a perennial championship contender, came to our gym with a boat load of fans, winning history and confidence. During the pregame warmups they were brash and their skill and overt confidence was on full display in front of a raucous crowd of both fan bases. As I looked at the opposing team's confidence and their "We're going to win this game" attitude, I also noticed the sheer blankness and fear that rested on the faces of my team. Everything that the past had taught them pointed to the inevitable conclusion that they were going to lose, and fear of that familiar, disappointing outcome overtook them.

I interrupted their warmup routine, huddled them on our bench, and went biblical. The words of the Apostle Paul filled our huddle. The words that Paul used to encourage his mentee Timothy (2 Timothy 1:7), I used to encourage these wide-eyed, blank-faced teenage athletes. I shared that I could visibly see the fear in their faces and that the fear that they were experiencing did not come from God. I preached that God has not given us a spirit of fear, but what He has given us is power, love and a sound mind! I shared that God had given them the power to go on that court and do what they had trained and prepared to do; that He had given them the requisite love for the game of basketball and for each other; and that He had given them all a sound mind to quiet the noise and to execute at a high level. It is my pleasure to tell you that they threw off their fear and went out and played a hard fought game and did something that they nor a good portion of the crowd in attendance that night thought they could do...They won!

In this New Year know that God, our Father, has not given us the spirit of fear, so whatever you face in 2025, do not fear! What He has given us is Power to handle whatever is in front of us; He has also given us His very nature to walk in and to share, which is Love, for God is Love; and lastly, He has given us a Sound Mind to stay balanced and to victoriously maneuver through all situations as we keep our minds focused on Him. Fear not, and win in 2025! Happy New Year!!!!





The Living Waters District is pleased to announce The Cameron Foundation approved a proactive grant of \$73,000 for the Ettrick Community Building Project.

The District is committed to repurposing the property for The Gathering at Washington Street, Inc. to use in community development work in the Ettrick community.

The Gathering and Open Table will serve as consultations to lead an evidence-based Community Convening model that aligns with the principles of asset-based community development. OpenTable and the Gathering will guide and train community partners and stakeholders to implement strategies that fully involve the people of Ettrick. By inviting and integrating their voices, gifts, strengths, and action, the community will drive and define their own vision for the closed Ettrick UMC property to create the solutions and social innovations they see possible.
